Don't Be Left Out in the Cold Water/Utility FAQs

During the winter season the Water/Utility folks are not able to obtain an Actual Read for a Touch Read or Ford Box covered with ice and/or snow. When an Actual Read is requested, the customer must uncover the Touch Read or Ford Box for a reading to take place.

Remember to also protect your water meter from theft, damage and freezing. Customers are cautioned that in very cold weather, the meters and plumbing may freeze although the meter has been installed in accordance with accepted practice. Additional protection from freezing may be necessary. The customer is held liable for all charges incurred for a damaged water meter. Currently, the Frozen Meter Charge is \$10.00.

Neighborhood Leadership Institute (NLI)

The NLI is an annual 12-week program that educates Dayton residents about local government, City of Dayton resources and community leadership. The 2009 program kicks off Thursday, March 12, 2009. Workshop locations vary and presentations cover topics such as Dayton's History, The Role of City Government, The Criminal Justice System, and Cultural Diversity; skill-building components such as Public Speaking and Small-Group Dynamics; and a day-long bus tour of Dayton neighborhoods. Class members also complete field assignments to expand their knowledge of Dayton, City government and the community at large. Code Red Notification Service

The City of Dayton is proud to offer CodeRED® – a new emergency alert system that relays information to residents by telephone. In an emergency situation, the high-speed messaging system can deliver customized emergency notifications and instructions at a rate of 60,000 calls per hour. Residents whose phone number is listed in the white pages of the telephone directory are automatically included in the database to receive CodeRED® messages. However, business and residents with non-listed numbers must register if they wish to receive the CodeRED® emergency notifications. Residents should register if they:

- > Want their cell phone called
- > Want to provide a work phone as a back-up to their home phone
- > Want to provide a caregiver back-up number
- > Recently moved and kept their old phone number
- > Have changed their phone number in the past six months
- > Use a TDD/TTY
