Ohio State Dog Laws and Local Information

Ohio law requires dogs three months of age or older to be licensed in the county of residence. Dogs must also be under the control of their owner at all times. Loose dogs can be impounded and the owners cited for violation. Additional information follows:

- **Tags to be Worn-** A valid license tag must be worn by the dog(s) at all times. Failure at any time to wear a valid tag shall subject the dog to impoundment.
- **Penalties-** Minor misdemeanor first offense; Minimum \$25.00 fine plus court costs. Fourth degree misdemeanor each subsequent offense; minimum \$75.00 plus court costs.
- **Rabies Vaccination-** All cats and dogs must be vaccinated against rabies by a veterinarian.
- **Bite Reporting-** Seek medical attention immediately! Report all dog and cat bites within 24 hours to the Board of Health (225-5700). If they cannot be notified within the 24 hours contact the police.
- **Barking Complaints-** There are no Ohio State laws addressing barking. The police department suggests that you contact the person responsible for the noise. Often times, they are not aware of the discomfort they're causing others. If you feel uneasy about contacting the person, or he/she has been uncooperative, you can call: 937-333-2677 (**non-emergency police number**) for police assistance.

Analog to Digital TV Transition

Please be aware that the entire country is in the process of transitioning free over-the-air television broadcasting from an "analog" format to an "all-digital" format. Analog TVs are commonly recognized by using "rabbit ears" or other antennae that do not require paid service with a cable company, such as Time Warner.

By law, February 17, 2009 is the last day for full-power television stations to broadcast in analog, and they will broadcast only in digital after that date.

However, there are ways to adapt existing analog television sets to accommodate the change-over without needing to contract with a cable company.

Adopt-An-Area Clean Up Volunteers Rock!

Thirty-five neighborhood volunteers from Fairgrounds, Linden Heights, Twin Towers, Southpark and Walnut Hills met Saturday morning, May 17 to rid our community of litter. Neighborhood Yard Standards

Check your yard conditions by using the 12- point checklist brochure available from the Division of Housing Inspection, One Stop Center, 371 West Second St., Dayton, OH 45401. Uncorrected neighborhood yard standard violations may result in a minor misdemeanor citation (costing \$100.00 or more) and/or legal notice being issued.
